2024-2025 USBC Membership Applications

USBC thanks you for your continued efforts in collecting accurate and complete information from your league bowlers on their USBC membership applications. Accurate member information improves the fulfillment of membership cards and member benefits to your league bowlers. A reminder that date of birth is required for all members, and ensuring you have good emails of your bowlers ensures they receive USBC news - such as the First Frame powered by Bowlers Journal – this season!

2024-2025 Playing Rules and Commonly Asked Questions

The 2024-25 USBC Rulebook is now posted and can be accessed <u>here</u>. The rulebook is available online and through the BOWL.com app. The online USBC Rulebook features a Table of Contents with direct links to rules and the inclusion of links throughout the rulebook that will provide quick access to referenced rules and CAQ's.



Adult/Youth Leagues

Adult leagues allowing USBC Youth members 18 or younger to participate must be certified as an adult/youth leagueand must comply with USBC Rule 400. Also, those 18 or older must

complete U.S. Center for SafeSport training. All officers must be Registered Volunteers (SafeSport trained and background screening through NCSI). See <u>Rule 100b</u> for more.

Youth Leagues

Promote your scholarship leagues. If you have unassigned funds in your SMART account, use them to promote bowling. Inform the parents/youth that you are adding additional scholarship funds to the prize fund and/or have the youth/parents help promote your leagues. For example: Everyone receives prizes in the form of scholarships, and for each new bowler you bring in, you both receive scholarship funds. This is a great way to have others promote your leagues.

When certifying your league, don't forget to include your SMART account number on the league application.
