Rules Quiz Answers

- #1 2 No To take scores from one certified competition for use in another certified competition would be using a Mail-O Graphic format which is not available for use in place actual scores bowled for an association championship tournament.
- #2-2- As this is a championship competition for the ADULT members of the association, only adult members of the association can compete.
- #3 5 Tournament management can utilize information gathered from numerous sources to make determinations on average adjustments for individuals.
- #4 4 Only adjustments done under <u>Rule 319c</u> are to be reported to USBC as an average adjustment. These will then be included on the <u>USBC Average Adjustment/Rerate List</u>.
- #5 2 Average adjustment actions done by the association for an Association Championship Tournament (Open, Women's or Youth) can be appealed to USBC
- #6-1, 2, 3 & $5-\frac{80}{2}$ states that averages from non-certified leagues cannot be used for entry purposes in USBC certified competitions

When there are concerns over the accuracy of the foul detectors, it is always a good procedure to have the center verify that the foul lights are operating accurately.
